



## Greenham Trust supports COVID recovery through physical activity funds

**22<sup>nd</sup> July 2021** – During the COVID pandemic, Greenham Trust has supported several charitable causes championing the benefits of sport. The most recent of these is Newbury Cricket Club's (NCC) redevelopment project to which Greenham Trust donated £50,000 in matched funding.

The Newbury Cricket Club clubhouse redevelopment project aims to raise over £205,000 to redevelop the clubhouse so that it provides a sustainable future for the club and for future generations to be able to access a cricket facility in the centre of Newbury. Greenham Trust's innovative match funding, offered through The Good Exchange platform, means that every £1 donated up to £50,000 became £2, helping every donation go even further.

A junior member of the Cricket Club commented, "The Good Exchange is absolutely brilliant as it brings everyone involved together to achieve a common goal. I'll be delighted when NCC's Pavilion is completed." Another said, "Raising money for Newbury Cricket Club means more people will have the opportunity to get involved with the sport and the club, which is good news for everybody!"

The Cricket Club has already held several fundraising activities including "Around the Grounds", where junior and senior members, parents and family and friends were sponsored to walk or run around all the county cricket grounds in the UK. This proved so successful, from both a distance and a fundraising perspective, that the target distance and funding target were increased. This initiative alone had raised over £82K (including gift-aid and match funding) within just a few weeks. The benefit of activities like this is that it encourages people to get active and connects different members of the community together.

Whilst the £50,000 of match funding has already been matched, the club still needs almost £39,000 to meet its final target. Donations can be made <u>here</u>.

Other sport and activity-related projects that Greenham Trust is supporting include:

- Get Berkshire Active's <u>Healthy Active Me</u> campaign Greenham Trust donated £5,000 to raise crucial funds to support three key elements of the programme physical activity kit bags to be sent to disadvantaged families, "Fit, Fed and Read Camps" which children can attend, and subsidised sport and physical activity sessions. - The Friends of Castle School aiming to raise £25,000 to revitalise the Castle School hydrotherapy pool used by children with special needs & disabilities. Donate here.
- Swings & Smiles sensory play spaces a £39,000 project to provide children with special needs and their families opportunities for support, friendship and play in an accessible environment. Donate <u>here</u>.
- East Ilsley Parish Council this successful fundraising <u>project</u> enabled a complete revamp of the playground in East Ilsley, providing more modern and exciting equipment to challenge and entertain the children.

In addition, West Berkshire Council has partnered with Greenham Trust with a fund to improve access to physical activities in West Berkshire. The West Berkshire Let's Get Active Fund 2021/22 is available to
